Parish Council Matters – November 2020



Blaise Farm Quarry

Cllrs Rickett and Jones attended a meeting at the Quarry and witnessed a blast taking place. Gallagher were keen to work with the village and take measures to mitigate the problems which have been occurring.

- They will be blasting at the current site for another year. When they move to the field on the other side of the footpath they will realign the passage of work to hopefully divert some of the tremors that are coming through the village.
- They are building a huge pile of earth between the quarry and the AD and IVC sites. This bund will divide the site into two so the quarry will be completely separate. The bund should help reduce the air overpressure and some of the vibrations that escape through the corridor past the AD and IVC sites.
- When they move excavations across into the field they are proposing to dig a trench along its northern edge. They will then work backwards away from the village and it is hoped that the trench will create buffer to reduce vibrations and air over pressure
- Normal lorry movements have resumed with blasting back to twice a week
- They do not intend to increase the blast size.



Blaise Farm IVC Site

TMBC have told us that Dunbrik Waste Transfer Station in Sevenoaks closes for around 8 weeks from 12 November for repair works following the fire there in the summer. Some of the vehicles that would have used Dunbrik will be diverted to Blaise Farm. TMBC will be informing residents of the potential delays to collections via our website and social media channels.

Blaise Farm AD Plant

They are still waiting for the Environment Agency to issue a licence and are using farm produce in the meantime to keep the system ticking over. Unfortunately, the plant doesn't function properly without the correct ingredients, which is why there were smells. Urgent action was taken to reduce the emission of unpleasant odours and hopefully this situation is now under control. It is a very technical plant and when using the proper ingredients there should be no smell.

Offham Landfill Site

Cllrs continue to liaise with the Site Operator.

Temporary Road Closure – Aldon Lane, Addington & Offham – 7th December 2020

Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on Aldon Lane, Addington & Offham from 7th December for up to 3 days between the hours of 09:30 and 15:30. The road will be closed from the junction with A20 London Road to outside number 2 Aldon Cottages, to the extent indicated by signs and barriers on site.

The alternative route for any through traffic is via Aldon Lane, Teston Road, B2016 Seven Mile Lane, A20 London Road and vice versa.

Access for emergency service vehicles and pedestrians will be maintained at all times during the closure.

The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce while tree surgery and cabling works are undertaken by BT.


