Tonbridge and Malling On and Off Street Parking Consultation

Residents are being given a say on changes to car parking charges across the borough. A review of all council-owned car parks could see the charging period in most places extended to 8pm and include Sundays and bank holidays. The introduction of charges to three car parks and two on-street areas which are currently free in Aylesford, Larkfield and West Malling are also planned along with options for increased parking capacity.

Parish Councillors object to these proposals and are concerned about the detrimental effect on businesses who rely on the free parking which allow people to "pop in" to shops, the Post Office, the Doctors Surgery etc.

Kent County Council

Councillor Hohler reported:

- KCC have made a decision about children's youth services. There will be a number of family
 hubs where parents can go to get advice and which can be easily accessed. More information
 will be provided in due course.
- There were 1,700 replies to the consultation about children's hubs. (thought this was better next to the appropriate point)
- She provided a fire brigade poster for Notice Boards.
- Sometimes KCC have to suspend what they are doing as there is so much pressure caused by taking unaccompanied asylum seeker children. This is not just a Kent problem; they see it as a National problem and believe the National Transfer System needs to be speeded up. KCC launched a judicial review which has been successful, and now the government are working with them to identify places children can stay.
- There is a new scheme to recycle laptops or phones so they won't be going to landfill: https://www.kent.gov.uk/environment-waste-and-planning/rubbish-and-recycling/device-recycling-scheme
- Government has allotted £4.296m to KCC for additional road repair funding for the next year and £134.5m over the next decade.

Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council



Councillor Dean reported:

- 40 Acres is the new development between Winterfield Lane and Rectory Lane. KCC has
 removed a lot of trees that weren't expected to be removed, many complaints have been
 received regarding this action. An application for Tree Preservation Order's was submitted to
 TMBC but wasn't processed in time as they have a backlog of TPO orders. Subsequently a
 retrospective planning application will be submitted in due course.
 County reports
- She has approved design costs for a 20mph scheme in West Malling.
- There is a proposal for a one-way system through East Malling.
- Kent Highways are beginning a system where they will collect data about car crashes that do not involve fatalities or serious injuries.
- KCC are looking for Parish Council land on which to install electric vehicle chargers.
- The budget is a big issue and it is looking very serious. They need to find £20m in savings this year and it is looking like there will be a £50-60m gap next year between money available and costs. So the budget KCC is looking at is extremely damaging. Nearly all youth services will disappear, which were delivered by an outside provider. There will be reductions in packages of support for children with disabilities, reductions in the cost of transport for children with SEN, and other plans will be reduced.
- A quick survey of WMPC following complaints about postal delivery showed about half the members are suffering problems with erratic delivery. This affects business and residents.
- There was a discussion about TMBC's on and off street parking consultation. Some traders in West Malling have expressed concern that their businesses may not survive if charges are brought in, and it would affect the monthly Farmers Market as traders park in Ryarsh Lane.

Police

PC Dylan McElligott has taken over the area from PC Lisa Whitehead.

Report:

On 07/12/2023, in Trottiscliffe there were approximately 7 shed/garage breaks whereby suspects took items such as tools, strimmers and jet washers. Police attended and disturbed the suspect who unfortunately managed to evade officers by travelling over fields which caused difficulty when pursuing them. There have been shed breaks in various locations across the Malling side of Tonbridge/Malling however, Trottiscliffe was particularly targeted on this occasion and it is not unusual for suspects to target one village before moving on to the next village nearby.

Advice I am offering to residents includes;

- Consider CCTV/Ring doorbells
- Shed alarm/motion sensors
- Secure locks that can't be cut
- Secure valuable items
- Dial 999 if there is a break in progress

Highways

The Parish Council continues to work with Kent Highways on the Highways Improvement Plan. Unfortunately, KCC Planning and Advice have decided after investigations that they will refuse the application to reduce the speed limit to 20mph on Teston Road through the Village and on Church Road. The Parish Council will consider this further.

Speedwatch

Speedwatch is operating independently of the Parish Council. Cllr Fred Steer is the co-ordinator. He is making great progress and if you would like more information about the group he can be contacted on fred.steer@offham-pc.gov.uk.

Kent Highways have generously offered funding to purchase Speedwatch equipment for the Village.

Play Area

The major fund raising project for years has been to refurbish the much loved and well used childrens play area.

Thank you to everyone who attended the two October clean up sessions which have helped keep the area clean and open for use.

Cllr Phil Bailey has led work to carry out essential repairs, which were carried out recently by Playdale.

Meanwhile, Cllr Sue Taylor has been leading plans to replace equipment, renovate the area, and to obtain grant funding. Following a consultation circulated to the Primary School and residents, 165 questionnaires were returned along with 30 letters of support and drawings from the children, Village societies, businesses and residents. This was an amazing response and showed how important the play area and recreation ground are in the village. Although all ideas have been considered, we cannot install a zip wire or skate park as we do not have the space in the recreation ground. However, many ideas that have been suggested have been taken into consideration with the design which has been formulated. More information will follow in due course.

Work has been allocated into two phases.

Phase One is for the Recreation Ground. Following a meeting with Cllr Taylor, Cllr Unter and the TMBC Planning Obligations Officer, Cllr Taylor has been able to secure £75,000 funding for out door sports equipment and replacement of the circular track in the Recreation Ground. New equipment

will include replacement football posts, nets, flags and a footballers shelter. Together with an iconic agility net, combination agility trail, table tennis table and chess table. This is fantastic news and has involved a lot of hard work. The Parish Council is incredibly grateful to TMBC for their support. The money is from s106 funds provided to TMBC from building works that have taken place in Kings Hill. The Parish Council has approved plans for the Recreation Ground. Councillors hope to be able to share details of the plans, and a start date for work, very soon. Cllr Taylor continues to work closely with TMBC and equipment providers.

Phase Two is for the enclosed play area. Again, Cllr Taylor has led the work to obtain plans and quotes, and has applied for a grant from FCC Community Action Fund. We will have to wait until March to see if the application is successful. The application is for 90% of the funding of a new and exciting enclosed playground scheme that will cost £83,375 VAT.

The Parish Council needs to provide 10% of the cost, and needs to also show third party funding. Work to fund raise will continue towards this essential project.

2024 Calendar

Cllr Sue Williams was congratulated for putting together the 2024 calendar, and together with Wendy Williams and other Councillors, there have been sales of £747.50. Thanks are given to Patrick Bligh for arranging and collecting a fantastic £520 in sponsorship. After printing costs, that leaves a profit of £642.50 towards parish projects.

TMBC Christmas Recycling and Refuse Collections

A consultation has recently opened to help identify public places in Tonbridge and Malling where women and girls feel unsafe.

Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council has teamed up with neighbouring West Kent authorities and the police for the project which will use public feedback to develop initiatives to strengthen community safety.

Violence against women and girls includes, but is not limited to, harassment, stalking, rape, sexual assault, murder, honour-based abuse and coercive control. While men and boys also suffer from many of these forms of abuse, they disproportionately affect women.

The online survey invites people to share their experiences of feeling unsafe in particular locations, such as outdoor public spaces, while commuting and socialising. It is being run in partnership with Sevenoaks and Tunbridge Wells borough councils and runs until Sunday 7 January 2024.

Pedestrian access will be maintained during the works.


The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce while allowing fibre works to be carried out, works are undertaken by Openreach.

We wish to continue to make playing for our junior and senior sides as accessible as possible and seek to avoid cost being a barrier to this happening. However, as with everything else, costs have increased for many things and so we have decided to increase subscriptions for the coming season. They will herefore be as followed:

Clubhouse and ground developments

As you will be aware we made many improvements to the environment last winter, upgrading our electricity supply, improving the bar area, installing new kitchen washing and storage, installing a TV and purchasing some new covers

During the season we have gone further and work has been ongoing to construct a new store, adjacent to the groundsmans shed in which to store our junior kit, bowling machine and other training equipment. This will allow the equipment to be stored, particularly in the winter, in a more weatherproof setting and make it more accessible for jun and senior training. This should be completed in the very near future





Further to our first aid training in January and a couple incidents in recent years we decided that improved access to a defibrillator would be desirable.

Consequently in partnership with the Offham Village Hall Committee and the Tennis Club we were able to secure a device via a cricket charity.

It has since been installed at the front of the village and is accessible, in an emergency, not only to our players and supporters, but also members of the public who maybe in need of it





We can also report that the square has had its annual end of season repair and refresh process, and the ground team has installed the fences to allow the sheep to arrive once again this winter.
