

#### Parish Council Newsletter – March 2024



#### Kent County Council

- KCC have had their budget meeting which was difficult. The most expense has been on record levels of investment in Adult and in Children's Social Care. Home to school transport for children with special needs is also expensive. KCC is trying to be as efficient as possible.
- The weather has been extraordinary, and Highways have put aside £8m to deal with it. The Government has given more funding. A KCC Cabinet Member is looking into quick and effective ways to deal with potholes.
- Companies need to come and mend leaks of gas or water etc in the highway and they are meant to book this work in advance, giving a good reason why it is needed. A new Cabinet Member is looking at ways to improve this system.
- Rural Officers working with Kent police recovered £400,000 worth of vehicles in one month.
- Kent Film Office handled 88 filming requests in the last quarter of 2023-2024 and logged 79 filming days. This brought £820,000 into Kent and Medway. Filming activity generates more than £5m per year for the Kent and Medway economy. KCC also raise money through weddings. Oakwood House has been refurbished as a venue for weddings and citizenship ceremonies. From April 23–January 24 there were 6,304 ceremonies in Kent.
- TMBC have refused the application for a new 24 hour lorry park at J2A of the M26, Wrotham Heath.
- There have been many problems with Ford Lane being closed due to a huge water leak. Work will be finished by Friday.
- The Trading Standards team have been working hard to stop illegal vapes coming into the country. The latest seizure was of over 1.000 boxes of illegal vapes. The legal limit of a disposable vape is around 600 puffs. Illegal vapes seized have 1,500 puffs so are seriously dangerous.
- KCC are running out of Government funding for buses. They don't have to do anything about school buses until 2025.
- 141 fewer people applied for a secondary school in Kent this year. This meant that 96% were offered one of their 4 choices, which is higher than normal.

#### <u>Highways</u>

The Parish Council has had a virtual meeting with Kent Highways on the Highways Improvement Plan. Results of traffic tests in the Village did not put Offham into the right band category to be considered for a 20mph limit. It is hoped Speedwatch will reduce speeds in the Village so that a 20mph zone can be considered by Kent Highways.

If not, other possibilities can be considered including Traffic Calming. Funding would need to be found for this, and measures such as width restrictions would need street lighting.

It is believed that the majority of the village would support a 20mph speed restriction.

White lines and road markings will be refreshed throughout the village to encourage drivers to slow down.

Aldon Lane will be closed for up to one day on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2024 for work to be completed by OpenReach. Details are later in the newsletter.

#### **Speedwatch**

There are 13 volunteers for Speedwatch and the first session has taken place on the 60mph stretch of Teston Road past Spadework. In an hour at 3.30pm on a Monday, 225 vehicles left the village with a similar number travelling into the village. No cars were found to be speeding and drivers were supportive of the scheme. This is a very positive start.

Cllr Steer will continue to work with the volunteers and the police and more sessions will run when the weather is better.

#### <u>Wellbeing</u>

The Men's Shed has proved very successful in the Village. Cllr Fred Steer has now set up a womens group – The Shedettes – who meet in the Kings Arms every Tuesday from 10 - 11.30am. The first meeting had 13 attendees who had a great morning.

#### Number 70 Bus Service

KCC Financial support for this bus was withdrawn on 12<sup>th</sup> February 2023.

Borough Councillor Mike Taylor has worked with Nu Venture to make sure villages have a continuing service once a week. For the last year he has been able to secure funding from KCC to pay for this. Funding has not yet been forthcoming for the year ahead.

Offham Parish Council has agreed to pay its share of the cost, £214.30, to make sure the bus service continues to run for residents.

#### **Recreation Ground Refurbishment – Phase One**

Phase One of the Works to the Recreation Ground has been funded entirely by a s106 grant from Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council, for which Councillors are extremely grateful. The money has had a very positive impact and will greatly benefit residents and users of the Recreation Ground.

Track works (tarmac) are completed. Work by Eibe to install equipment for the football pavilion, climbing frame chess table and agility trail will commence on 18<sup>th</sup> March and will take 7-10 days. Unfortunately the closure of some spaces in the Recreation Ground car park are needed and more details are later in the newsletter. Graphics will be added to the track on 27<sup>th</sup> March and will take about half a day. Phase One will be completed before Easter.

Due to the weather, the contractor hasn't been able to fully finish the track and there are dips where the earth is not level with the track. Any work done now will be damaged when the equipment is installed, so it was decided to wait. Cllr Marchant will seed the area and when it is settled he will dress it later in the summer with top grade soil. The Parish Council will pay for this with money raised from project funding, to make sure the Recreation Ground is left in a good condition.

The gate to the Recreation Ground needs a new post. It was agreed that the Parish Council would Pay for this, using money raised for project funding.

#### Play Area Refurbishment - Phase Two

The FCC Environment Board meet on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> March to consider the Parish Council's

application for funding for stage two of works to improve the enclosed Play Area.

#### Hayes Lane

The verges either side of Hayes Lane form part of the Village Green, which is owned by the Parish Council. It has been noted that cars parking on the verges have created holes, and Councillors were mindful of the need to keep the area safe.

The Parish Council has arranged with the contractors carrying out the track works in the Recreation Ground to use some leftover aggregate to fill the holes and keep the area flat and safe. This is a simple and cost efficient remedy, until there is funding for a long term solution. Although it does not look as good as grass it is hoped this will be longer wearing.


#### **Dear Resident**


The Parish Council is delighted to have received £75,000 of funding from Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council towards sports equipment and materials for the Recreation Ground. This money is being used for Phase One, which covers work to the Recreation Ground. The Parish Council is applying for funding, which if successful, will be used for Phase Two to improve the equipment inside the enclosed play area.

Work is almost finished to extend and improve the track around the Recreation Ground making it safer and more accessible. Concrete bases have been laid for various pieces of equipment. This equipment will be installed from 18<sup>th</sup> March, by Eibe and Redlynch Leisure.

Careful consideration has been given to the location of the equipment, to make sure it is safe, will be well used, and will not harm the view for residents bordering the Recreation Ground. Adjacent to Teston Road will be a Football Shelter. This is partially open, with lower panels to protect users from bad weather. The lower panelling will be covered by the external hedges and will not be seen by residents. The agility net, while quite high, will not block the view as it is being position near to the enclosed play area, near the hedging which borders Council Bungalows. The other equipment will be located around the outside of the Recreation Ground Area.



Aldon Lane, Offham, will be closed outside Aldon House, between the hours of 09:30 and 15:30 only. To the extent indicated by signs and barriers on site.

The alternative route for any through traffic is via Aldon Lane, Teston Road, B2016 Seven Mile Lane, A20 London Road, Aldon Lane and vice versa.

Pedestrian access will be maintained during the works.


The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce to allow Openreach works to be carried out, works are undertaken by Openreach.
